

INVITATION TO TENDER

REPAIRS TO AN EXISTING 50,000 IMPERIAL GALLON ELEVATED STEEL TANK LOCATED AT PEPPER, SAINT ELIZABETH

The National Water Commission (NWC), through its Technical Services Department – Western Division, intends to repair an existing 50,000 imperial gallon elevated steel tank located at Pepper, Saint Elizabeth

The NWC hereby invites tenders from suitable contracting entities currently registered with the National Contracts Commission (NCC) at Grade Three (3) minimum in the category of Tank Erection or at Grade Four (4) minimum in the category of Civil Engineering, for the repairs to the tank.

Prospective tenderers may obtain documents as of **Friday, November 14, 2008**, between 9.00 a.m. and 3.00 p.m. each weekday at the Technical Services Department, 1 Lower Bevin Avenue, Montego Bay (Tel: 940-4447, Fax: 952-8682). Documents will be available at a **non-refundable cost of J\$3,000.00 each**. Payments will be accepted in cash or manager's cheque only (at the Commercial Department).

Tenderers must submit a valid copy of their Tax Compliance Certificate (TCC) and current Certificate of Registration from the National Contracts Commission (NCC) along with their tender. Tenders not accompanied by a valid TCC or NCC will result in automatic disqualification.

The original of both Certificates must be presented at the opening of tender or within five (5) working days of the opening thereof.

Tenders must be returned in a plain envelope (as outlined in the Instructions to Tenderers), which is sealed and appropriately marked on the outside:

All tenders submitted will then be opened on **Wednesday, December 3, 2008**, at 1 Lower Bevin Avenue, Montego Bay commencing at 2:30 p.m. in the presence of tenderers/representatives who choose to attend.

A tender bond representing 1% of the tender sum is required for all tenders.
