LOW VOLTAGE CAUSES WATER SUPPLY DISRUPTION IN SECTIONS OF ST. CATHERINE & THE CORPORATE AREA

The National Water Commission is advising its customers in sections of the corporate area who are served by the **Jubba Springs and Cookhamdene Water Supply Systems** that the disruption they are experiencing in their water supply is due to single phase problems at these facilities.

Additionally, the **Tulloch Springs system, Bybrook Wells, Wakefield Well and the Sligoville Wells in St. Catherine** are also out of operation due to similar low voltage issues.

Communities in the corporate area affected by these downtimes include: **Jacks Hill, Barbican, Billy Dun, Tavistock, Millsborough, sections of Jack's Hill Road, Skyline Drive, Mountain Spring, Scott Level Road and Peter's Log, Spanish Town Road and all roads leading off, Molyne's Road, Washington Boulevard and all roads leading off, and sections of Downtown Kingston.**

In the meantime, affected communities in St. Catherine include: **Sections of Portmore, all communities along the Sligoville main road, Buxton Town, Wakefield, Savannah, sections of Linstead, Bog Walk, West Prospect, Cashew Walk, Cow Gully, August Town Road, Berwick, Crawl, Church Road, Princessfield, Knollis Housing Scheme and Burton**

The power company has been informed and every effort is being made to restore normal power supply to the systems.

The National Water Commission apologizes for any inconvenience caused and will ensure the earliest return of service to its valued customers.
