WATER SUPPLY DISRUPTION

National Water Commission customers in **sections of St. Thomas** who are served by the **Springfield Water Supply System** are being advised that the disruption they are currently experiencing in their service is due to a mechanical problem associated with the system.

The facility has been taken out of operation temporarily for repairs and will continue to be out of operation until Thursday, March 3. Water will therefore be trucked to customers in the areas served by this facility until operations resume.

These areas include:

Morant Bay, Western Prospect, Springfield, York, Duhaney Pen, Alexander Park Roselle, Retreat, Lyssons, Seaforth and Highbury

In the meantime, customers in **sections of St. Catherine** served by the **Friendship Well** will experience a disruption in their water supply on **Tuesday, March 1, between the hours of 8:00am and 5:00pm** due to a scheduled power supply disruption by the Jamaica Power Supply Company Limited. Areas that will be affected by this disruption include:

Fairfield Road, St. John's Road, Homestead, Clayton Heights, Fletcher's Lane, Willowdene, Hopedale, Villa Nova, Old Harbour Road, Sydenham, Cromarty Housing Scheme, Leiba Gardens., Horizon Park, McCooks Pen, Hartlands and Innswood Village Estate. Customers in these communities are being urged to store water for use until regular service is restored.

Similarly, customers in **Smokey Vale, Diamond Road, Wireless Station Road and Mount Salus in St. Andrew**, will experience an interruption in their water supply on **Wednesday, March 2, between the hours of 6:00am and 6:00pm** as the **Hydra Drive Relift Station** will be taken out of operation to carry out pipeline repair works. Customers in these areas are also encouraged to store water for use during the period of disruption.
