**WATER SUPPLY DISRUPTION  
..SECTIONS OF ST. ANDREW & ST. THOMAS AFFECTED**

The National Water Commission wishes to advise some customers in sections of the corporate area who are served by the **Mona Treatment Plant** that the low water pressure or no water conditions they are currently experiencing is due to emergency pipeline repairs being carried out on a 21” distribution main.

Areas affected by this disruption include:

**Stanton Terrace, Herb Mckinley Drive, Roosevelt Avenue, South Camp Road and Campbell Town.**

Similarly, customers in sections of **St. Thomas** who are served by the **Springfield and Apple Farm water supply systems** are being advised that the disruption they are experiencing in their service is due to power supply problems at these facilities. This has been reported to the Jamaica Public Supply Company Limited and every effort is being made to restore normalcy to these systems.

The company is also reporting that mechanical works will be conducted at the **Mona Treatment Plant on Thursday, April 28, 2011 between the hours of 8:00pm and 4:00am and also on the Havendale Well on Friday, April 29, 2011 between 10:00am to 4:00pm.** Customers who are served by these facilities are therefore urged to store water for use during the periods of disruption.

The National Water Commission sincerely regrets any inconvenience caused to its valuable customers in these instances.
