WATER SUPPLY DISRUPTION

The National Water Commission is advising that it is currently experiencing electrical problems at the **Tulloch Springs facility in St. Catherine** which has resulted in operational downtime on the system. Customers who are served by this system will therefore experience low water pressure and no water conditions until the matter is resolved.

Areas affected by this disruption in service include:

Sections of Portmore, Eltham, Eltham Acres, Ensom Acres, St. Jago Gardens, Waterloo Gardens, Patten Park, Richard Hall, Spanish Town Road and all roads leading off, Molyne Road and all roads leading off, Washington Boulevard and all roads leading off and sections of Downtown Kingston.

The Commission is reporting that the system is being worked on presently and every effort is being made to restore normal water supply at the earliest possible time.

In the meantime, customers in **sections of Portland who** are served by the **Drapers Relift Station** are being advised that the facility will be taken out of operation on **Wednesday, July 20, 2011 between the hours of 8:00am and 5:00pm** in order to carry out mechanical works.

Areas that will be affected include: Drapers, Drapers Heights and San San, customers in these communities are therefore urged to store water for use during the period of disruption.

The National Water Commission apologizes for any inconvenience caused to its valued customers.
