**WATER SUPPLY DISRUPTION
...SECTIONS OF ST. THOMAS & ST. ANDREW**

The National Water Commission is advising that the **Dumfries Relift Station and the Mount Pelier Pumping Station, in St. Thomas** are currently out of operation due to mechanical problems. This has resulted in no water conditions in the following communities: **Dumfries, Newland, Pondside, Lowden Hill and Pamphret**

The NWC is reporting that the necessary repair works are in progress and every effort is being made to restore water supply at the earliest possible time.

In the meantime, customers in sections of **Stony Hill, St. Andrew** are being advised that they will experience disruptions in their water supply between **9:00am and 6:00pm daily** as the Jamaica Water Supply Improvement Project works continue in the area as previously reported.

Areas that will be impacted include:

Seaview Road & Brooks Level Road today, July 25;
Stony Hill Main Road & Golden Spring on Tuesday, July 26;
Seaview Road and Newton Road on Friday, July 29, 2011.

Customers in **Golden Spring, Temple Hall, Mount Ogle, Halls Green, Rosemount, Rodwell Terrace, Panton Road, Christopher Drive, Fort George and Stony Hill Square** will experience low water pressure or no water conditions between **8:00am on Thursday July 28 and 5:00pm, Friday July 28, 2011.** Customers in all the mentioned communities are therefore being urged to store water for use until the restoration of normal service.

The National Water Commission sincerely regrets any inconvenience that may be caused to its valued customers in these instances.
