**SCHEDULED WATER SUPPLY DISRUPTION
... ST. ANDREW AREAS TO BE AFFECTED**

The National Water Commission is advising that **the Mona Treatment Plant, in St. Andrew, will be shut down temporarily from Monday, August 15 at 8:00pm to 6:00am on Tuesday, August 16, 2011** to facilitate **urgent maintenance works** on the plant. This will result in disruption in water supply to the following areas:

Mona Heights, Cross Roads, Mountain View Road, Old Hope Road, Hope Road, Hope Flats, Papine, Gordon Town, Beverly Hills, Ravina, Mona Road, Devon Square, Waterloo Road, Cassia Park, New Kingston, Eastwood Park, Red Hills Road, sections of Grants Pen, Half way Tree Road and Upper Maxfield Avenue.

Additionally, customers and commuters in the **Stony Hill areas of St. Andrew** are also being reminded that they will continue to experience disruptions in their water supply and lane closures for the period **August 15 to 19, 2011**, as the **Jamaica Water Supply Improvement Project (JWSIP)** works are carried out in their communities.

This week's work schedule will require **a three day closure of the Seaview Filter Plant starting from Monday, August 15 through to Wednesday August 17, 2011** which will result in no water conditions or low water pressure in some instances. Areas that will be impacted for the duration of the works include: **Stony Hill, Golden Spring, Jacks Hill, Stilwell Road, Lawrence Tavern, Tavistock, Mannings Hill, Bridgemount, Sunset Avenue, Boone Hall, Mt. Ogle, Sherbourne Heights, Belmont Drive, Old Stony Hill Road and Armour Heights.**

Customers in these communities are being reminded that water supply disruptions will occur from 9:00am to 6:00pm daily and where necessary, lane closures can be expected during the hours of 8:15am to 6:00pm. Commuters are also urged to obey the instructions of the flag personnel on location.

The National Water Commission sincerely regrets any inconvenience that may be caused by these necessary works and urges customers in all the mentioned areas to store water for use during the periods of disruption.
