IMPROVEMENT WORKS TO DISRUPT WATER SUPPLY

As the National Water Commission continues the Jamaica Water Supply Improvement Project (JWSIP) works in Stony Hill, St. Andrew, customers in the area are being reminded that they will experience disruptions in their water supply as well as lane restrictions. Areas that will be affected for the week **Monday, September 5 to Friday, September 9, 2011** include:

Kingswood Road, Monday, September 5, 2011

Seaview Road and Newton Drive, Tuesday, September 6, 2011

Montgomery Drive, Wednesday, September 7, 2011

Diamond Road, Thursday, September 8 to Friday, September 9, 2011

Customers in these areas will experience water supply interruptions between the hours of 9:00am and 6:00pm daily while lane restrictions, where necessary, will occur from 8:00am to 6:00pm for the stated period.

In the meantime, customers served by the **Constant Spring Treatment Plant in St. Andrew** are also being advised that they will experience similar disruptions in their water supply on **Tuesday, September 6, 2011 and Thursday, September 8, 2011 between the hours of 8:00am and 4:00pm** on each day.

These interruptions in service are to facilitate improvement and refurbishing works that will be carried out on the plant under the Jamaica Water Supply Improvement Project. Areas that will be affected include:

Constant Spring, Norbrook, Cherry Gardens, Havendale, Half Way Tree, Lady Musgrave, Liguanea, Manor Park, Shortwood, Graham Heights, Aylsham, Allerdyce, Acadia, White Hall Gardens, Belgrade, Kingswood, Riva Ridge, Eastwood Park. Gardens, Hughenden, Stillwell Road, Cassia Park, sections of Barbican Road, Russell Heights, Constant Spring Gardens, , Mannings Hill Road, Red Hills Road, Arlene Gardens, Roehampton, Smokey Vale, Lower Jacks Hill Road and Tavistock.

Customers in the Cassia Park area may experience a longer delay in the full restoration of their service on Tuesday, September 6, 2011 as this downtime will also be used to facilitate a pipeline relocation exercise in the Cassia Park Fording by the National Works Agency.

The National Water Commission regrets any inconvenience caused by these necessary improvement works and urges customers in the mentioned areas to store water for use during the periods of disruption.
