Conservation Tips

IN THE KITCHEN

- A dripping faucet can waste up to 7,600 litres (2,000 gallons) of water per year.
- Wipe away gravy, grease and food scraps from plates and bowls before washing.
- If you wash dishes by hand, don't leave the water running for rinsing. If you have two sinks, fill one with soapy water and one with rinse water. If you have only one sink, gather washed dishes in a dish rack and rinse them with a panful of water. Similarly, don't let the faucet run while you clean vegetables. Just rinse them in a sink or a pan of clean water.

OUTDOORS

- Instead of washing driveways, sidewalks, gutters and steps, use a hard broom to sweep these areas.
- Don't use fresh water for your plants and garden. Save the rinse water from your kitchen or laundry, and do your watering in the early morning - this prevents fungus growth, which occurs when you water at dusk.
- Don't let your children play with taps, hoses and sprinklers. Their innocent frolic on a hot day could waste hundreds of gallons of precious water.
- Wash your car with a bucket of water and a rag, not a running hose.

In our determined drive to improve and expand the sewerage network protecting the health and environment of the Corporate Area, the National Water Commission (NWC) through its contractor D. Bisasor & Associates has commenced extension of the existing sewer trunk main and connected laterals along Mona Road from its Bamboo Avenue intersection to its intersection with Blue Castle Drive. The work will also involve construction of a branch sewer along Bonner Pen Lane.

During the project, the National Water Commission and its contractor will make every effort to keep disruptions and inconveniences to an absolute minimum. Unfortunately however, some temporary inconvenience will be unavoidable.

The public is therefore advised that this necessary improvement work will result in traffic being reduced to single lane only along sections of Mona Road during the construction period.

The public is advised to observe the instructions of assigned flag persons and avoid the areas of work wherever possible. The National Water Commission apologizes for any inconvenience caused.
