## CORPORATE AREA WATER MAINS REPLACEMENT AND MAINTENANCE WORKS

### **There are 4 basic ways to save water:-**

#### **Economize -**

Be conscious of the amount of water you utilize and use less whenever you can.

#### **Fix Leaks -**

A leak of merely 1 drop per second, wastes 2,400 gallons per year! Most leaks are easy to repair with some basic know-how and a few simple tools.

#### **Water-saving Devices -**

There are a number of simple devices that can significantly reduce water usage. These include aerators, flow regulators and displacement devices.

#### **Re-use Water -**

Used water, such as at the kitchen sink and at the washstand, is often suitable for other purposes. If this "grey water" is used more than once it saves water for other uses.

In our determined drive to continuously improve our water supply service and reduce losses and damage caused by frequent breaks on pipelines in the Corporate Area, the National Water Commission will soon re-start maintenance Emergency Mains Replacement and Improvement Works in the following areas:

- Hall Boulevard from its Shortwood Road intersection through to Hall Crescent at its intersection with Carmel Avenue and including Whittingham Avenue, Close and Way as well as Hollywood Drive in the Aylsham area of St. Andrew.
- Norway Terrace from its intersection with Norbrook Drive in Manor Park
- Spring Way from its intersection with Water works Road and Norbrook Drive
- Rován Heights/Farringdon Drive/Riva Ridge/Rován Drive off Jacks Hill Road
- Red Hills Road from its junction with Leas Flat proceeding southerly to its junction with Queen Hill Drive continuing south along Queen Hill Drive to its junction with Perkins Boulevard
- South Camp Road, from its intersection with Merrion Road at the traffic lights proceeding southerly to its intersection with Vitoria Avenue at the traffic lights (to be implemented in conjunction with the National Works Agency NWA)

These projects will be implemented commencing in April 2006. During the implementation, the National Water Commission and its Contractors will be making every effort to keep disruptions in water supply, disruptions to vehicular and pedestrian traffic as well as other inconveniences to an absolute minimum. Unfortunately however, some temporary inconvenience is unavoidable.

The public is therefore advised that these necessary maintenance mains replacement and improvement works will result in traffic being directed as approved by the relevant road authorities.

The public is advised to observe the instructions of Police and assigned flag persons and avoid areas of work wherever possible. The National Water commission apologizes for any inconvenience caused.
