### **OPERATIONAL CHALLENGES DISRUPTS WATER SUPPLY CLARENDON AND ST. CATHERINE AFFECTED**

The National Water Commission is advising customers in some sections of **Clarendon who are served by the Kellits/Crofts Gate Water Supply**, that the disruptions they are currently experiencing in service, is as a result of maintenance works been carried out on the transmission network lines.

Affected areas are:

.

**Kellits, Crofts Hill, Good Hope, Tait Pedro, Rhoden Hall, Guava Ground, Hickely, Comsie and Jericho.**

Customers are being assured that the National Water Commission is working to restore regular water supply by **Monday September 18, 2017**. In the interim water will be trucked to the affected areas.

Meanwhile in **St. Catherine**, customers served by the **Yangs Well Pumping Station** are without water supply due to electrical problems affecting operations at the plant.

Areas impacted are:

**St. Jago Heights, Thompson Pen, sections of Twickenham Heights, section of Tryall Heights, Sections of Spanish Town, Greendale and sections of Mount View Estate.**

While, customers served by the **Ewarton Pumping Station** are without water supply due to irregular power supply.

Affected areas are:

**Ewarton, Mt. Rosser, Waterloo, Bennett Shop, Old Mt. Diablo, Leslie Road, Cassava Pond, Lluidas Vale Main Road and Charlton.**

In addition, the **Colbeck Pumping Station** is currently out of operation due to mechanical issues affecting operation at the Station. Restoration time will be by **Thursday September 21, 2017.**

Areas served are:

**Avairy Housing Scheme, New Harbour Village Housing Scheme Phases 1 & 2, Planters and Bois Content**
