NWC WORKING TO RESOLVE DAMAGED MOTOR AT BROWN’S TOWN FACILITY

The National Water Commission (NWC) is apologising to its customers in Brown’s Town, St. Ann who are impacted by the electro –mechanical issue (damaged motor) that has forced the shutdown of the Minard facility in St Ann.

The Company is noting that work has already begun to remove the pump equipment which is attached to an eight-inch pipeline submerged approximately 700 feet below ground. Given the extensive work necessary to repair and re-install the damaged motor, the NWC has implemented a trucking and piped supply schedule to provide relief supply for customers until October 4, 2022.
