OPERATIONAL CHALLENGES CAUSE WATER SUPPLY DISRUPTIONS COMMUNITIES IN ST. THOMAS, CLARENDON AND ST. ANN AFFECTED

The National Water Commission is advising customers in some sections of **St. Thomas**, served by both **Arcadia and South Haven Pumping Stations** that the disruptions they are currently experiencing in their water supply are as a result of mechanical problems at the stations.

Following the completion of an assessment, the NWC will provide a further update regarding the resumption of operations at the facilities. Meanwhile water will be trucked to the affected areas.

Areas affected are: **Arcadia, Guinep Lane, Long Hill, Western, Yallahs, South Haven, Llundville and Baptist**

Meanwhile in **Clarendon and St. Ann**, some customers are without water as a result of JPSCo power supply problems affecting facilities in these parishes.

Facilities and areas served are:

Clarendon- Peace River, York Town and Bell Plain water supply facilities

Affected areas are: **Peace River, Gloucester, Victoria, Lodge, Thompson Town, Cove, Wesleyan Gully, Blackwood, Elgin, York Town, Howells Content, Bullards Content, Hopewell, Parnassus, Denbigh Drive, Foga Road, Four Paths Settlement, Belle Plain, Osbourne Store, Folly Bush, Swansea, Old Road, and Comfort**

St. Ann- Thatch Hill Pumping Station

Areas impacted are: **Mile End, Union, Upton, Lodge and Four Roads**

Customers are being assured that the NWC will restore their regular water supply as soon as normality returns to these facilities.

The National Water Commission apologises for any inconvenience caused by these disruptions in service.
