## **NWC/Miya CONTINUES NON-REVENUE WATER REDUCTION PROGRAMME**

HOPE FILTER PLANT AND CONSTANT SPRING SYSTEMS TO BE SHUT DOWN TO FACILITATE WORKS

The National Water Commission is advising that as part of its ongoing Non-Revenue Water Reduction programme being carried out with Co-management Partners Miya International, the company will be conducting system maintenance works in several sections of the Corporate Area.

These works are scheduled to facilitate valve and meter installations which will result in water supply disruptions to the following areas:

**Tuesday, March 13, 2018 from 8:00 pm to 8:00 am Wednesday, March 14, 2018 (overnight)**

Areas include:- **Long Mountain Country Club Tank, Pines of Karachi, Beverly Hills Tank # 1 & 2, Upper section of Beverly Hills, Cross Roads, Mountain View, Vineyard Town, Cavaliers Reservoir (Marescaux Road), Sections of Downtown, Sections of Trench Town, Glenmore Road Booster, Windward Road, Rockfort, Old Hope Road, Hope Road (below Liguanea), Devon Square, Waterloo Road, Sections of Half-Way-Tree, New Kingston, Harbour View, Shooters Hill Booster, Shooters Hill, Airport, Port Royal, Kings House Booster.**

Other areas include: **August Town, Hope Flats, Papine, Gordon Town, Mona Heights, Hope Road, Beverly Hills, Hope Pastures, Ravina, Liguanea, Up Park Camp, Sections of Barbican Road**

**Thursday, March 15, 2018 from 8:00 pm to 8:00 am Friday, March 16, 2018 (overnight)**

Areas include:- **Constant Spring, Norbrook, Cherry Gardens, Havendale, Half-Way-Tree, Lady Musgrave, Liguanea, Manor Park, Shortwood, Eastwood Park Gardens, Hughenden, Constant Spring Road & Gardens, Camperdown, Mannings Hill Road, Red Hills Road, Arlene Gardens, Roehampton, Calabar Mews, Zaidie Gardens, State Gardens, Molynes Road, Washington Boulevard and Dunrobin Avenue.**

**Saturday, March 17, 2018 from 8:00 pm to 8:00 am Sunday, March 18, 2018 (overnight)**

Areas include: **Spanish Town Road, Marcus Garvey Drive, Washington Gardens**

Customers are being encouraged to store water for use during the disruption period specified. Additionally, motorists and pedestrians are being advised to observe the traffic signals of the work crews on site.
