**OPERATIONAL CHALLENGES DISRUPTS WATER SUPPLY SECTIONS OF ST. ANDREW AND ST. MARY AFFECTED**

The National Water Commission is advising some customers in Rural St. Andrew, that the disruption currently being experienced, is as a result of JPSCo power supply problems which are affecting operations at some facilities.

Affected areas and facilities are: Facilities- **Bucky Plain King Weston Isaac Hole and Mahoney Pumping Stations. Unity, Fern Hill, Pigeon Valley, Grant Hill, Goulbourne Belmont, Grant Hill, Florence Hill, Lawrence Tavern, Mount Ogle, Matthew Road, Toms River, Cokely, Johnny Ridge, Claypole Road, Lawrence Tavern, Burnt Shop, Unity, Mahoney, Rose Hall, Lawrence Tavern, Cassava River, Moount Olive and Assett Hill**

Customers are being assured that the National Water Commission will restore their regular water supply as soon as normality returns to the facilities Meanwhile in St. Mary, some customers served by the Enfield Pumping Station are without water supply due to a broken main on the network.

Restoration of water supply is estimated to resume by tomorrow, Saturday January 12, 2019.

Areas impacted are: **Dover, Epsom, Windsor Castle, Enfield and Juno Pen**
