NWC GETS NEW VEHICLES FOR OPERATIONS

Just in time for the New Year, the National Water Commission (NWC) has received 50 new motor vehicles to boost its operational mobility and replace some units in its aging 450-unit motor vehicle fleet.

The new fleet of vehicles include 50 full panel vans and 5 half panel vans for use islandwide with some being already earmarked for the NWC's ongoing Kingston and St. Andrew (KSA) Non Revenue Water (NRW) Reduction Programme.

The purchase of the new vehicles is seen by NWC President Mark Barnett as one step by the NWC in reducing motor vehicle maintenance expenses and operational costs while at the same time increasing mobility and responsiveness to customer service issues.

The new vehicles which were recently received at the Commission's Marescaux Road complex are now being appropriately outfitted before being deployed islandwide.
