**WATER SUPPLY REGULATIONS TO COMMENCE IN CORPORATE AREA
NIGHTLY REDUCTION IN OPERATIONS TO BE IMPLEMENTED**

The National Water Commission is advising that water supply to areas supplied by the Mona Treatment Plant will begin to experience nightly water supply disruptions as the Company commences water supply regulations on Thursday, January 30, 2020 in a bid to safe guard water supply throughout the impending dry periods.

The Company is noting that both major water storage facilities in the Corporate area (Hermitage Dam and Mona Reservoir) are now reflecting storage levels of (89 and 82 % respectively). This, the NWC says underlines the significant impact that the reduced inflows are already having on the NWC's operations.

Based on the nightly reductions in operations, customers may experience low pressures or no water conditions until regular supplies are restored the following morning.

Start Time: 9:30pm nightly

Restoration Time: 5am the following morning

Affected areas include: **Sections of Mona Heights, Old Hope Road, Hope Road, Hope Flats, Lady Musgrave Road, Sections of New Kingston, Sections of Half Way, Hagley Park Road, Maxfield Avenue, Molynees Road, Sections of Harbour View, Mountain View Avenue, Cross Roads, South Camp Road, Downtown Kingston, Beverly Hills, Ravina, Mona Road, Devon Square, Waterloo Road, Cassia Park, Eastwood Park, Half way Tree Rd, Upper Maxfield Avenue**

Customers in the affected areas are being urged to store water for use during the period of disruption.

The NWC also seeks to assure the public that every effort will be made to provide improved supplies once restore their regular supply ahead of the stipulated timelines.
